SECTION 2 — HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

Hazard class: Carcinogenicity (Category 1). May cause cancer (H350). Obtain special instructions before use (P201). Do not handle until all safety precautions have been read and understood (P202). Use personal protective equipment as required (P281).

SECTION 4 — FIRST AID MEASURES

Call a POISON CENTER or physician (P311).

If inhaled: If breathing is difficult, remove victim to fresh air. Keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing (P304+P341).

If in eyes: Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses if present and easy to do so. Continue rinsing.

If on skin: Wash with plenty of water.

If swallowed: Rinse mouth. Call a POISON CENTER or physician if you feel unwell (P301+P330+P312).

SECTION 5 — FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Nonflammable solid.

When heated to decomposition, may emit toxic fumes.

Flinn Suggested Chemical Storage Pattern: Inorganic #2. Store with acetates, halides, sulfates, sulfites, thiosulfates and phosphates. Use only in a hood or in a well-ventilated area.

Wear protective gloves, protective clothing, and eye protection. Wash hands thoroughly after handling (P264). Use only in a hood or in a well-ventilated area. In case of inadequate ventilation, wear respiratory protection (P285). Exposure guidelines: (as cobalt) PEL 0.1 mg/m³ (OSHA); TLV 0.02 mg/m³ (ACGIH)
